

BRANDENBURGER TOR

This place, which is now over 200 years old, has seen many ups and downs in our history. From Napoleon through to the rise and fall of Hitler, the Cold War and the reunification of Germany. The Brandenburger Tor is probably the most iconic monument in German history. It is now a symbol of peace and unity. The atmosphere of freedom, the impressive architecture and the history behind it, is what makes this one of my favorite places in Berlin.



WARSCHAUER STRASSE

ABOUT THE CITY



FERNSEHTURM

Constructed during the Cold War around 1970, the TV tower is the most emblematic landmark in the city. It is the highest building in Berlin and you can see it from everywhere. Nowadays it is a big tourist attraction, there is a restaurant inside and different kinds of tours related to the history and construction of it. The markets, stores and street life make this a great and interesting place to visit and enjoy.

The Victory Column was built in 1864 to commemorate the Prussian victory against the Austria-Bavarian allies before the period of the Berlin Republic. In recent history and nowadays, it is the meeting point for big public events. The famous techno love parade, gay parade (CDS) or even the celebration of the World Cup back in 2014 are just a few events that have taken place around this gold statue.
